

**Implementation Guidelines for Education of the Five Ways of Life
Scholarship of the Transdisciplinary Program of the College of
Education,**

National Taiwan Normal University

1. The implementation is based on the Key Points for Education of the Five Ways of Life Scholarship of National Taiwan Normal University.
2. Award recipients: Students of the Program. First-year students shall apply for the scholarship starting the second semester.
3. Awards:
 - (1) Moral Education Award: Those who have displayed qualities of specific performance in shaping character education, clarifying moral value and creating campus atmosphere, and enthusiastically serving others and caring for the society.
 - (2) Intellectual Education Award: Those who have shown acquisition of subject knowledge or performance of academic professionalism or skills, and can serve as role models for peers.
 - (3) Physical Education Award: Those who have shown specific performance in promoting body conditioning, fitness, physical and mental health and good exercise habits to become role models for peers, or have performed well in sports competitions.
 - (4) Social Education Award: Those who have demonstrated concrete results of practicing teamwork, facilitating relations between people and elaborating on collective efforts, and have leadership skills to encourage mutual assistance and friendship with peers.
 - (5) Aesthetics Education Award: Those who have an awareness of aesthetics and an understanding of art and culture, who demonstrate a concrete expression of humanistic, artistic, and musical talent, and who can serve as role models for their peers, or who participate in competitions related to art, literature, and music with outstanding performance.
4. Quota of awards and application and recommendation methods:

The scholarship is issued once every semester, and the selection process is described as follows:

 - (1) When there are students who meet the criteria of the awards and have specific performances, each class can recommend 1 candidate for each of the moral, intellectual, physical, social, and aesthetic education awards. For the award that has no applicant,

the quota can be used for other awards. Each student may receive only one of the awards.

- (2) Students who are interested in applying for the Education of the Five Ways of Life Scholarship can prepare the application form and relevant information showing their concrete performances of great merit, and send them to the Office of the Transdisciplinary Program of the College of Education. Academic and career advisors will refer to the selection criteria (as attached) before making recommendations.
- (3) The homeroom teachers shall submit the recommendation forms and lists of students to the Office of the Transdisciplinary Program of the College of Education before October 15 in the 1st semester and March 20 in the 2nd semester.
5. Sources of funding: The funding for the scholarship awards comes from student university fees and incentives.
6. Records of the awards won will be kept in the University's student learning digital records database.
7. Students who have won any one of the five awards of moral, intellectual, physical, social, and aesthetic education from the Education of the Five Ways of Life Scholarship are issued a Certificate of Merit in Honesty-Integrity-Diligence-Simplicity and then commended at the graduation ceremony.
8. The implementation measures become effective after being approved at the meetings of the Student Class Affairs Committee, and the same will apply to any revision.

Moral Education Award (those who have not received a disciplinary record of minor demerit or above in the previous semester)	Participation in tutoring programs or a variety of student service activities in or outside the University during the summer or winter vacations	40%
	Participate in character and extracurricular altruistic learning activities, including reading, writing, book clubs, seminars, and so forth	40%
	Other specific deeds related to good personal conduct	20%
Intellectual Education Award	Participation in academic seminars, exhibitions and other activities on and off-campus	40%
	Organize or participate in book clubs, book and newspaper discussions on and off-campus	40%
	Other specific deeds related to promoting academic quality and professional development.	20%
Physical Education Award	Participation in various sports activities (group or individual) or competitions on and off-campus with good performance.	40%
	Participation in physical training or continuous physical activities to develop regular exercise habits.	40%
	Other specific deeds promoting fitness and physical and mental health.	20%
Social Education Award	Active participation in club activities on and off-campus, and shows results in teamwork	40%

	Experience as a student club officer or demonstrates leadership skills.	40%
	Other deeds that encourage teamwork and promote group interests.	20%
Aesthetic Education Award	Active participation in art and cultural activities on and off-campus with excellent performance results.	40%
	Continue to participate in art and cultural training on and off-campus, and have shown expertise in aesthetics education.	40%
	Other deeds that help promote aesthetic literacy.	20%
