Article 1 The Study Guidelines are established based on the academic regulations of the National Taiwan Normal University (hereinafter referred to as the "University") to help students in the Transdisciplinary Program in College of Education (hereinafter referred to as the "Program") follow relevant course rules and achieve the purposes of exploration in diverse fields and cross-domain learning.

Article 2 Duration of study:

- 1. Students in the Program have either 3 semesters or 4 semesters of study.
- 2. Students in the Program after the streaming in the 1st semester of the second academic year or the 2nd semester of the second academic year will follow the study regulations of each respective department (Bachelor's Program).
- Article 3 Students in the Program need to take common mandatory (including general education) courses, the required and elective courses of the Program, introductory courses of each department (Bachelor's Program), highlight courses and specialized courses.
 - 1. The University's common mandatory (including general education) courses: Subject to the relevant regulations of the University.
 - 2. The Program's required courses: Introduction to University, Self-understanding and Career Development, and Introduction to Interdisciplinary Studies.
 - 3. The Program's elective course: Educational Statistics (I).
 - 4. Introductory and highlight courses of each department (Bachelor's Program) are listed in Table 1 of the Study Guidelines. Students of the Program must complete the required courses of the Program and at least one introductory course in each of three departments (Bachelor's Program) before they become eligible to apply for streaming.

- The highlight courses are designed to raise students' interest in the diverse exploration of the division of departments (Bachelor's Program). The students from the Program are free to take the electives, but some courses may need the consent of the instructor.
- 5. Specialized courses of each department (Bachelor's Program) are listed in Table 2 of the Study Guidelines. The specialized courses are designed to help the students of the Program, who are certain in their goals of streaming after one year of exploration in University, take the credit courses of each respective department (Bachelor's Program), to relieve the pressure of needing to take many courses after the streaming.
- Article 4 Students of the class must prioritize taking the courses offers by the Program. The same type of courses taken elsewhere outside the Program without the prior approval by the Program will not be accepted as part of the Program's courses.
- Article 5 Students of the Program who complete the required courses of the Program and at least one introductory course in each of three departments (Bachelor's Program) may apply for streaming during the 1st semester of the second academic year or the 2nd semester of the second academic year. For the streaming process, please refer to the rules of the Streaming. Implementation of the Transdisciplinary Program in College of Education, National Taiwan Normal University. The courses taken in the department (Bachelor's Program) during the study in the Program are considered elective credits if they are not the courses offered by the Curriculum Streaming Department (Bachelor's Program).
- Article 6 Students of the Program are allocated to each department (Bachelor's Program) in accordance with the Program's regulations on division streaming starting from the second academic year. The Program does not offer students from other departments to apply for double majors or a minor with the Program.
- Article 7 For the rules on academic transfer, please refer to the University's rules on the transfer from departments (institutes).
- Article 8 Any outstanding issues not specified in the Study Guidelines are to be handled in accordance with the University's academic rules.
- Article 9 The Study Guidelines are formulated by the Program's Student Class Affairs Committee, then forwarded to the Curriculum Committee of the College of Education for review, and then submitted to the Academic Affairs meetings for deliberation before implementation, and the same will apply in case of revision.
